Activity of Mount Pelée

Saint-Pierre, September 25, 2026, 16:00 local time (GMT-4)

Volcanic seismic activity

Between September 18, 2026 at 16:00 (UTC) and September 25, 2026 at 16:00 (UTC), the OVSM has recorded **198** volcanic earthquakes:

- **181 volcano-tectonic** type earthquakes. The largest on has a magnitude **M_{lv} = 0.93**. The others are of lower energy. These earthquakes are located at depths between 1 and 1.4 km below the summit of the volcano.
- **15 shallow hybrid** type earthquakes of low energy. These earthquakes are located around 1 km beneath the summit of the volcano.
- **2 shallow long-period** type earthquakes of low energy, located around 1 km beneath the summit of the volcano. The largest on has a magnitude **M_{lv} = 0.64**.

No earthquake was felt by the population.

The week before, the OVSM had recorded 123 earthquakes of volcanic origin. As of September 25, and during the last 4 weeks, the OVSM recorded a total of 665 volcanic earthquakes, corresponding to an average of **166 to 167 volcanic earthquakes** per week.

Deformation at Mont Pelée

Since May 2026, the OVSM has recorded multi-centimeters ground displacements in the summit area of Mont Pelée. The maximum extension recorded near the summit over the past four weeks was **0.6 cm** (along a 570-m-long profile), declining compared to the previous month. These displacements are consistent with deformation of the volcanic edifice induced by an inflating pressure source located at a depth of approximately 1 km beneath the summit.

The probability of eruptive activity in the short term remains low. However, considering the observations accumulated over the past months and years, an evolution of the situation in the medium term (weeks to months) cannot be excluded.

The alert level, in accordance with the provisions planned by the authorities, is currently **YELLOW: vigilance**.
